Deon has been a long-time member of our church. She is currently our Finance Chair, beginning this year, but has been working with our children as our Sunday School leader and teacher for many years.



The outreach committee has some upcoming events to help others in our community.

Saturday Academy will be held in March this year on March 8,15, 22, and 29th. The hours will be from 9am – noon. We will be looking for volunteers to help lead life skills or provide an extra pair of hands to those teaching life skills, or extra hands for the people preparing breakfast and lunch. We also would like to start a Wesley day of Service project. The idea for this is to provide opportunities for others to help in our community by volunteering to help others, such as yardwork for the elderly, working at a non-profit, or any other non -skilled projects someone may have. If you have any ideas to serve others in our community or know of someone who might need some help. Let one of the members of the outreach team know. We are looking at a date in April. We would like to have as many volunteers as possible and try to provide help to as many people as possible.

Our first quarter Melody of Compassion for 2025 is the United Methodist Church in Bolivia.

The Wisconsin Conference has a partnership with the Bolivia Evangelical Methodist Church. The Wisconsin point person for the Bolivia Partnership mission is our own Rev Anita Lang. Bolivia is a poor country with poor churches. The median income for a Bolivian Methodist is less than \$2/day, the definition of extreme poverty by the U.N. The majority of the membership live in poor rural villages, and not in the cities. This means that funds for church growth, construction, and training must come primarily from sources other than the local church. The cost of land, construction, and new pastors is greater than what the Church in Bolivia can afford. There are similar situations in the other large cities of Bolivia. There is also a need to repair and expand many of our older chapels throughout Bolivia.

The Bolivia and Wisconsin conferences mutually collaborate in supporting the "Casa del Adulto Mayor" in its mission to honor and care for elderly members of the community. The Bolivia Conference is actively working to find ways to furnish this residential housing facility for the elderly and seeks financial support along with prayers from local churches. Your gifts will help provide spiritual and material support for the care and wellbeing of many families in the church and wider community. An important mission that brings help and hope to the vulnerable. Your kind generosity is greatly appreciated.

In Bolivia, the contributions that women make to the church, the community, and their own families is astounding. They require sewing machines to support themselves, their homes, and local churches.

In the current situation: they only have one machine that can accommodate 30 ladies, and they are unable to increase production. In order to help make possible the work they do; the Wisconsin Conference is working to provide sewing machines for these sisters in faith.

Local churches in the Bolivian Evangelical Methodist Church are facing difficult times due to the pandemic, post-pandemic effects, inflation, and rural needs. The newly appointed bishop, Rev. Medardo Vedia Gutierrez hopes that some of the churches in the WI Conference will sponsor a local church in Bolivia for one to two years. In Bolivia, Bishop Vedia listed nine local churches that are praying for a church in WI that might be ready to answer God's call.

The goal is to build relationships, pray for each other, and learn and communicate with people from different cultures. Local churches in WI could assist local churches in Bolivia with minor projects like Instruments- guitar, bass, and drums for worship Mattresses, chairs, plates, a kitchen stove, chairs for the sanctuary, etc. One of the first churches to support a church in Bolivia was Elkhorn FUMC. The rural church in Bolivia is building a new church at the Zamora location thanks to the support of this congregation.
