



HYMN SING SUNDAY

Our Hymn Sing Sunday on March 23 was a blessed gift to all of us. It was so wonderful to recall memories of our favorite songs and the connections to family and friends associated with each hymn. DS Ebenezer Insor, in his benediction message, reminded us of the importance the Methodist traditions of praising our Lord with song, calling our attention to the prolific hymn writers John and Charles Wesley. He also challenged us to go out from the service and look up the scripture references from our favorite hymns. I have included some scripture references from our song list for you and encourage everyone to look up the scripture from their favorite hymns. You will see how God's word is reflected so beautifully in our musical heritage.

The last hymn on our list was "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" and was included as a tribute to Dodie Smith and her continuing love of the old hymns. The first stanza of the song is *Come, ye thankful people, come, share the gift of harvest home.* As many of you may know, the name of the memory care residence where Dodie now lives is *Harvest Home*. The owners chose the name from the hymn and scripture. That fact guided Dodie's children to choose that home for her, knowing that she would be provided with Christian love and care into the future.

Our Melodies of Compassion for the 2nd Quarter Boys and Girls clubs of America.

The Boys and Girls Clubs of America had its beginning in 1860 with 4 women in Connecticut who believed boys who roamed the streets should have positive alternatives leading them to form the 1st club. The cornerstone of the experience was that the club focused on capturing boy's interests, improving their behavior, and increasing their personal expectations and goals.

In 1906, several Boy Clubs decided to affiliate, and this started a nationwide movement to the national organization.

In 1956 Boys Clubs of America celebrated its $50^{\rm th}$ anniversary.

In 1990, to recognize girls were part of their cause, they renamed the organization "Boys and Girls Clubs of America".

The Boys and Girls Clubs of America provide a safe haven for over 3 million children, giving them an opportunity to discover their great futures. They also have a commitment to inclusion and believe every kid has what it takes. Their mission and core beliefs fuel their commitment to promote safe, positive, and inclusive, environments for all.
