#### TRUSTEE RESPONSIBILITES

The simple answer to "What are the trustee responsibilities?" is:

Maintain the grounds and building and garage and create a safe and comfortable environment for everyone using the facilities.

Grounds maintenance includes plowing the entire lot and snow blowing the sidewalk—3/4 of the entire block. Plowing is hired out while snow blowing has been handled by trustee volunteers. The summer requires grass cutting - with both a rider and hand mower- and trimming and edging 1 mile of sidewalk. Trimming of trees and bushes, again done by volunteers. In addition, all equipment needs regular maintenance, replacement and gas.

Building maintenance involves heating, air conditioning, hot and cold water, elevator, office equipment, lighting and all cleaning. Much of the work is handled by the trustees, some of the work needs to be hired out, and we never turn down volunteers to help keep Wesley a clean and efficient space for worship, meetings and other special events.

If you see something that needs attention, contact the church office so the trustees can work to resolve the issue or find the people who will do so. Doing this and respecting the building will make Wesley a safe and more comfortable environment for all using our Wesley home.

#### A VIEW FROM THE PEW

One of the misconceptions of our modern Christian language is that we constantly are telling people that they need to invite Jesus into their lives. The reality is that God doesn't want to be invited into **your** life, God wants you and invites you to be a part of **God's** life. The famous question "What would Jesus Do?" Is irrelevant- we are not Jesus and could not do what Jesus could, even if we wanted to. The real question we should be asking is what would God want US to do? God wants us to be a part of the community and the relationship that makes up the Holy Trinity.

As Jesus tells Nicodemus in the famous verse John 3:16, For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth on him should not perish, but have eternal life.

This is how God showed his love for the world. Now, it gets challenging though. Because God calls us into his relationship, and to live after Christ's example before the world. God is active, vital, and loving this world right now. What is amazing is that God invites **us** to join him in that work. This is God's purpose for us, and I think that many of us have taken a wrong step here. We are not here to judge and punish people for not living up to God's standards. We are asked to place our lives in God's life, and when you do, the difference is amazing.

No longer are people nasty, petty, selfish; instead they are poor, hungry, and ignorant. They do not need to be punished and corrected, they need to be fed, healed, defended, and taught. The whole world is different, as we see things anew. That is because we are seeing things through God's eyes, not our own. We are walking through life while living as part of the community of God. It is hard to do that and not feel for people created in His image. It is hard not to feel compassionate about feeding the hungry, helping the sick, and reaching out to the poorest in spirit. It is hard to sit back and watch people be oppressed, tortured, and even killed. That is because when we place ourselves inside of God's life, we are changed.

The God we worship is a God of unconditional love. We are invited into relationship with Him. We are appointed stewards of God's creation, called to be his Hands and Feet. As we stand at the fork in the road we realize that the path we need to walk is the one God is walking. When we are ready, we step forward in the work God is doing, the love that God is showing. When we decide to give our lives to God, when we are born again of the Spirit, we are invited to join that relationship. And it is an ACTIVE relationship, not a Stewardship outsourced to Government, the Global Church, or even to our Church leadership.

Lately, we are constantly bombarded by calls to Unity. We are told that unity is strength and a virtue. But is it? Really? Nicodemus left a unified community of faith to seek a closer relationship with God, because he knew there was something missing. Throughout history, and in popular culture, the mob may be strong, but that doesn't make them the hero. Was the Mob that called for Jesus' crucifixion right because they were many? Maybe, just maybe, we are better off ignoring the louder voices in the country and instead following the call of Jesus, to enter into his life, His world.

God's call is to US, echoing through the ages, Saying 'Come join in my Loving relationship with creation. Use what I have given you.' How will you answer? God showed his love by sending his Only begotten Son. How will you show your love?

#### Faith, Hope and Love

In 2013 the founders of Hope, Faith and Love learned that children entering foster care, sometimes taken out of dangerous situations, had 5 mins to collect their belongings-usually in a black garbage bag. That year they started giving out duffel bags with personal care and comfort items. Since they started giving out the duffel bags, they have given away more than 6,500. Since 2022 they have serviced all 72 counties of Wisconsin. Their hopes for the children when they receive the duffel bags are:

They know that they are loved, it is important for the children to feel comforted. They feel at home, they want the children to feel safe, valued, and significant during their transition.

They have confidence, instead of feeling vulnerable and afraid during uneasy circumstances,

They maintain a healthy lifestyle; the duffel bags contain hygiene supplies so they can continue to maintain healthy habits.

#### **Duffels For Kids include:**

Duffel bag

- Fleece blanket
- Stuffed animal
- Storybook
- Flashlight

• and Hygiene items: toothpaste, toothbrush, hair brush, shampoo/conditioner and lotion (ages 3-17) deodorant (ages 10-17), baby wipes, powder, shampoo, wash, and lotion (ages 0-2)
