As I write this, I'm in Charlotte, North Carolina for the postponed 2020 General Conference of the United Methodist Church. I was elected a provisional reserve delegate in the last Wisconsin Annual Conference. Last week, the body voted on approving the elected delegates to official reserve delegates. Today (Monday, April 29), I had my badge changed to one that recognizes me as a Reserve Delegate in addition to my volunteer role as a page for the conference. I will be going to the North Central Jurisdiction Conference in July at Sioux Falls, SD.

The General Conference voted to approve Regionalization for the UMC structure. What that means is conferences in Africa, Europe, Philippines, and the United States will be on the same level-the US now being a region instead of encompassing the whole denomination. This move is to hopefully make the structure equitable and working towards decolonizing the institution. This is momentous as this places all members of the global church on the same level without giving preference to the US churches. This move decentralizes power and hopefully gives authority and actions based on the contexts of the people in the specific region.

In the midst of this General Conference, I flew to Oakland, California (April 24-28) to attend a world conference put on by the Othering and Belonging Institute from the University of California, Berkeley. I was attending as part of the Gamaliel Race and Power Institute where I'm going to give trainings on Intercultural Communication/Diversity and Inclusion.

Both events (the General Conference and the California conference) have opened new ways of being present in the world—a world where we as a church and a society can have the exciting potential to be beacons of inclusion, honoring differences, and finding ways to celebrate our unique gifts and views to bridge and build spaces of belonging.

It is a new day in many ways. And as change happens, I hope there is grace and gratitude for all that has been given and lived, and an exciting anticipation for all things new.

We can Caravan down there as we have in the past. There are a variety of jobs available. Some of those jobs include packing, sitting and applying labels, or lifting boxes into the warehouse.

Volunteering policies

Thank you for considering volunteering with FMSC! Below we've listed a couple important details that are good to know when preparing to pack meals at any Feed My Starving Children site or MobilePack™ event.

Volunteer age requirements

Please follow this student-to-adult ratio when registering to volunteer:

For safety reasons, children under the age of 5 are not allowed in our packing area (sorry, no exceptions)

Sickness

To ensure the safety of our volunteers, staff and the food we pack, please do not come to our facility to volunteer if you have new or unexplained symptoms indicative of contagious illness or food-borne diseases (excluding conditions related to seasonal allergies or known noncontagious medical conditions):

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Jewelry policy

To comply with FDA requirements and remove all opportunity for foreign objects to fall into our life-saving meals (which could cause choking, tooth breakage and more), FMSC volunteers must remove all jewelry and/or accessories before packing.

- No jewelry is permitted in the packing room, labeling areas, Warehouse Crew area or when inspecting raw ingredients.
- Prohibited jewelry includes earrings, watches, rings, necklaces, pins, brooches, etc.
- Wedding bands are permitted. However, if your band has a stone, you will be required to wear a glove.
- Facial piercings, gauges and new earrings that lock in the back are permitted (please inform a staff member).
- Medical alert bracelets and necklaces may be worn.

May is Mental Health Awareness month, throughout the month NAMI actively participates in this national movement which was started in 1949. This time is dedicated to eradicating stigma, extending support and fostering public education and advocating policies that prioritize the well-being of families affected by mental illness.

Nami has a helpline that is a free national peer support service providing information, resource referrals, and support for people living with mental health conditions, their family members, caregivers, mental health providers, and the public. 1-800-950-NAMI (6264) or text "Helpline" to 62640. The NAMI teen and young adult helpline offers a direct connection to another young person who shares similar experiences and is prepared to offer information and resources. 1-800-950-6264 or text "friend" to 62640.

1 in 5 adults experience mental illness each year and only $\frac{1}{2}$ receive treatment.

1 in 20 adults experience a serious mental illness each year and only 2/3 receive treatment.

The average delay between onset of mental illness symptoms and treatment is 11 years.

7 in 10 Americans (72%) agree that people with mental health conditions face discrimination in their everyday lives.

Only half (53%) say they are familiar with the U.S. mental care system.

There is a free seminar for family and friends of persons with mental illness that will give tips and resources to help them. They are available both virtually and in-person this month.

MIDWEST MISSION

We are a logistical conduit for Christ's ministry. We receive a request from trusted nonprofits, then prepare items we have and ask our supporters for items we need. Volunteers process, revitalize, and assemble the donated items. Then, donations are shipped to our trusted partners to distribute to those in crisis.

Bringing the hearts and hands of God's people together to transform resources into humanitarian relief.

The conference Mission Motivation Committee is working with Midwest Mission Distribution Center to collect items for **Personal Dignity Kits** and **Home Care Kits.** Midwest Mission distributes these items locally, nationally and internationally to those in need during times of crisis. All supplies are given free of charge regardless of gender, race or religion. Although we are focusing on these two kits, we appreciate any items found at midwestmission.org. All items should be NEW – and all kits should have only the items requested.

Urgent needs include the following:

- Shampoo (in bulk), 12-19 oz.
- 100-150 oz. EMPTY liquid laundry detergent containers. We can use containers of any size up to 150 oz. (we are collecting full or empty liquid laundry detergent containers)
- Sewing machines, electric and treadles (they don't have to be new; we accept sewing machines that need a little tuning up; we cannot accept the computerized ones.
- Medical equipment -folding walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, canes, walking boots, slings
- Blankets- new or gently used for disaster response
- Non electric tools specifically shovels, brooms, rakes

United Women In Faith (UWF) will be collecting OLD USED CLEAN SOCKS to support a project to raise funds for the Northcott Neighborhood House. We will be participating in a joint project with other UWF groups, within the State, to support this effort. It is sponsored by Gildan, makers of Goldtoe socks working with TerraCycle. There are two positive outcomes for doing this project. We can earn funds for Northcott Neighborhood House, and it will keep hundreds of pounds of old used socks out of the landfills!

Northcott Neighborhood House is one of the Wisconsin Conference's Health and Welfare Ministries that support families, youth and individuals in the Milwaukee area. Northcott Neighborhood House in Milwaukee came into being in 1961. It was the result of Methodist women in the Milwaukee area who helped to take the census and realized that there were thousands of impoverished in their assigned area. Joined by the Board of Global Ministries, they established this neighborhood center. UWF has been a staunch supporter of this Ministry since the beginning. This endeavor will help to raise funds to continue this support.
