GRACE NOTE The Many Hats We Each Wear

If you would like to join us or learn how to crochet or knit and cannot make it to one of these dates, please let Kathy Mulroy know, and we could possibly add another date and time to the schedule.

Last month we learned about the health benefits of knitting. This month I will give you 7 health benefits of crochet, so being part of the Wesley Yarners has definite health benefits so please think about joining us.

- 1. Crocheting helps with insomnia: By focusing on something that's easy, repetitive, and soothing, like crochet projects, you can calm down your mind and body enough to let you fall asleep. So the next time you're tossing and turning in the middle of the night, don't get frustrated, just pick up a work in progress!
- 2. Crocheting reduces stress and anxiety: When you're feeling stressed or anxious in your daily life, take some time for yourself, pick up some yarn and your hook (or your needles), and spend some time being creative. By crocheting and allowing yourself to be creative, you're taking your mind off of whatever's been nagging you. By focusing on the repetitive motions of individual stitches and counting rows, your mind is able to be more relaxed and free from anxious ideas and thoughts.
- 3. Crocheting helps ease or relieve depression: When we do something we like, our brains release dopamine, a chemical that affects our emotions and functions like a natural anti-depressant. Scientists now believe that crafts, such as crocheting, can help stimulate that dopamine release to allow us to feel happier and better about ourselves.
- 4. Crocheting reduces the risk of Alzheimer's by 30-50%: By engaging in cognitive exercises and stimulating your mind, you can slow down or even prevent memory loss. Whether you plan on challenging your memory by learning a new stitch or technique or simply by reading and working up a pattern, by getting a little crafty, you'll be helping preserve your memories.
- 5. Crocheting builds your self-esteem: We all want to feel productive and useful, and by working up a project to give as a gift or sell at a craft fair, we can do just that. Though we don't craft just for the compliments, a little bit of external validation by someone buying your finished item or your gift recipient wearing that crochet hat you made all winter long can truly give us the self-esteem boosts we need.

- 6. Crochet acts like group therapy: For those who seek therapy benefits in group settings, crocheting can be supremely beneficial. By placing So the focus off of the patient and only the crochet project itself, it provides all of the previously mentioned health benefits of crocheting plus a sense of community and togetherness. By working in a craft, those in a group can immediately have some way of relating to the other group members, and it may help function as an ice breaker for more serious conversations. Even if you aren't actively seeking therapy, you can benefit from the sense of community that crocheting can bring.
- 7. Crocheting puts you in control: Whether you feel helpless as a caregiver watching someone struggle or you're the one struggling with your own illness or problems, crocheting is a way to put the control back into your own hands literally. By choosing to craft, you are in full control of everything, from the type of project you'll be making, the color and type of yarn and even the type of crochet hooks to work with, and that makes a difference in feeling like you have a say again.

So please join us for your health both knitting and Crochet will benefit you and benefit our community.

KAIROS MINISTRIES

Kairos Outside Weekend #7 will be Friday, November, 17, through Sunday, November 19, 2023, at Spencer Lake Christian Center in Waupaca, WI. This is a special weekend for women who are impacted by having a loved one who is incarcerated. It is a free weekend for these women as a form of Agape (God's Love delivered by God's people). Agape is a tangible example of our Lord's love as we have been commanded to "Love One Another".

There are various ways that you can provide agape for these special ladies:

- 1. Providing a room for our guests to sleep in. The cost of a room for each guest is \$125.00 per person. We do not ask our guests to pay for the weekend. It is a gift to them.
- 2. Purchasing a meal. Each meal costs \$10.00 per person. We will be providing each guest with 6 meals throughout the weekend. A meal ticket is put at each guest's place at the table to show that her meal was provided as a gift.
- 3. Coloring a weekend logo. After coloring the logo, please sign it with your first name only and where you live. These logos will be put on the walls of the conference room where our guests will be learning about our best friend, Jesus, and the unconditional love that He has for each one of us.
- 4.Personal Agape from the Christian community. These items are placed on the beds of our guests to demonstrate how much God cares for our guests. These are simple gifts that provide a profound message of God's love.
- 5. Prayer Chain. Using strips of colored construction paper we will build a prayer chain just like the simple paper chains that children make for Christmas trees. We ask that you write a blessing on a strip of paper, sign your first name, and where you live so that when the prayer chain is brought into the conference room, our guests will know that there are people who do not know them that are praying for them throughout the weekend. We hope to have a prayer chain long enough to wrap around the conference room.
- 6. Financial support. If you would like to go above and beyond, we are asking for financial support to not only underwrite the cost of the Kairos Outside Weekend, but also to provide you with the opportunity to respond to Christ's call to all Christians.
- 7. Attend the "Walking in Lover" Service on Saturday, October 18th.

Please check out the Kairos Prison Ministry International display table in the church's narthex. The room slips, meal tickets, weekend logos, and prayer chain strips will be on the table. If you would like to provide personal agape, we are asking for 30 items, one for each guest (we are praying to have 30 guests for this weekend). The cost of these items is to be kept minimal (ie: 30 bookmarks, 30 handmade items, 30 fidgets, etc). These items should be identical.

The 4th quarter Melodies of Compassion is Kairos Ministries, our own Mary Borckardt is involved with this great organization. **Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc. (Kairos)** is a Christian faith based ministry which addresses the spiritual needs of incarcerated men, women, youth, and their families. By sharing the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, Kairos hopes to change hearts, transform lives and impact the world. Kairos sprang from the Cursillo movement and is supported by volunteers from the 4th Day movements such as Cursillo, National Episcopal Cursillo, Presbyterian Cursillo, Lutheran Via de Cristo, The Upper Room's Walk To Emmaus, and independently ecumenical Tres Dias as well as volunteers from independent and non-denominational churches. As a ministry, Kairos embraces a diverse group of volunteers working together to fulfill Christ's call to action in Matthew 25:36.

Kairos **Vision** is a community spiritually freed from the effects of imprisonment reaching all impacted by incarceration, through the love, hope, and faith found in Jesus Christ. The **Mission** of Kairos Prison Ministry is to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to impact the hearts and lives of incarcerated men, women and youth, as well as their families, to become loving and productive citizens of their communities.

Kairos of Wisconsin will be holding an outside weekend on Friday November 17-Sunday November 19 2023 at Spencer Lake Christian Center in Waupaca, WI. This is a special weekend for women who are impacted by having a loved one who is incarcerated. It is a free weekend for these women as a form of Agape (God's love delivered by God's people) Agape is a tangible example of our Lord's love as we have been commanded to "Love one another".

Please check out the Kairos Prison Ministry International display table in the church's narthex. There is information on the table to help with this Weekend in November. For our 4th quarter melodies any loose change in the collection plate goes to help Kairos and their mission to spread God's love to others.
