DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY

Disciple Bible Study is a program of intensive, disciplined Bible study. Each study group is made up of 12-14 participants led by one or two facilitators. Groups meet weekly for 1.5 - 2 hours for 34 weeks. Disciple I, the prerequisite for all other Disciple Bible Studies, covers the entire Biblical story, from Genesis to Revelation.

Books are required for the participants, and will cost \$16, but if money is any sort of obstacle, please let me know- I'm not going to let cost be a barrier to anyone.

We are checking to see if there is interest in *starting this session in September* on Sunday evenings at the church. Sessions will run 90 minutes to two hours, and we would meet weekly. This is a very in-depth and intense course and will require a good deal of reading between classes.
