The Hope of a Tree

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. (1Cor 3:6-7)

Four years ago, the trustee members in Lancaster UMC came and planted a tree in front of the parsonage. It was a plum tree that looked so small and pretty. To plant it, Steve and Helen came to my parsonage, cleared away grass, dug 2 feet of ground, extracted stone and cut down the roots of a tree. There was lots of work for planting a small tree.

Why did trustees plant a tree in front of a parsonage? There would be some reasons. However, the more clear and bigger reason would be that they have planted a tree to make the parsonage look good. I believe that they planted it with a heart of love for God and a pastor. Also, I believe that they planted that kind of hope.

In truth, we Christians also need to plant such a tree. What kind of tree should we plant between God and us? Fundamentally, we must plant a tree of faith, rooted in the belief that God loves us so much that He sent Jesus, and through His love on the cross, we are saved. And we should pray that this tree continually grows.

So, what kind of tree should we plant at this time? Although many things have returned to their original state after COVID, the church has undergone many changes. I believe that during this time of change, in this period of recovery where we are returning to the pre-COVID days, we should plant a tree of hope. We are Christians who live our faith, believing that we are children of God with eternal life. We live our faith with the hope that all members of our families will continually experience God's grace.

Furthermore, we hope that our church will return to the beautiful days of its golden era. I believe that you and I are planting this very tree of hope. You have shown your desire to be like this through various acts of love, and you are showing it now, and I believe you will continue to show evidence of it in the future.

For a tree to grow, it needs to be watered after it is planted. What kind of water can we provide? Above all, how about watering it with gratitude? It may seem like there's nothing to be thankful for, but how beautiful it is to discover the hidden secrets within God's providence. Just as gratitude increases the more we express it, I believe that if we continue to water with gratitude, much more hope and thankfulness will overflow in our lives, in our families, businesses, church, and community.

It would also be good to water it with kind words and encouragement. I feel really good when you say kind things about me. I also try to say many good things to you. If we do this, I believe our church will become a church that people want to come to, a better church.

With this hope in mind, we have designated September 15th as National Back to Church Sunday. I also consider this day as our church's Homecoming Sunday and am making efforts to ensure that many people can come. Let's make an effort to gather our children, descendants, relatives, and friends in our church so that we can worship together. On that day, we see the hope of fellowship in Christ. I believe this will be the starting point and the driving force for the hope of our church.

I pray that God's grace and hope overflow in your life and in your families.

Winter Gear collection


